The Park & Recreation Board would like to assist with the candidate search.
- 3) Park Pond Remediation Work completed by Mike Rhineer Excavating. Present residents commented on the great work that was completed on the parks pond. This remediation work was well overdue and was paid for from a grant received from Hurricane Sandy. The board would like to recognize, and would like to thank Mr. Robert Porterfield for all his work securing these funds. The Park & Recreation Board would also like to thank Mr. Mike Rhineer for his excellent work.

Board Comments: None

Public Comments: Two primary concerns have been brought to the attention of the board. 1. Over spraying - The diameter of the spraying around trees is excessive. There is concern about concentration and how it is being applied. Concerns have been raised about the potential of it killing the trees do to over use and concentration. 2. Mowing – Questions have been raised about mowing, just to mow, when the length of grass does not warrant mowing due to dry conditions. This appears to be a common practice, which should be reviewed. Cost savings of taxpayers funds for fuel cost should be considered as fuel prices continue to rise. Park crew could do other much needed work instead of mowing during these times such as trimming, etc.

A resident asked if it is possible to rent the pavilion by the Ball Field for a craft sale.
