CALL TO ORDER

Chair Purdum called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM and led the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING(S): Chair Purdum moved to approve the minutes of the August 21, 2019 Supervisors Meeting. Supervisor Edwards seconded the motion. The motion passed with four (4) Supervisors voting in favor; Supervisor Evans-Herr was opposed. She said she didn't get these minutes until just now and Chair Purdum said that none of us did, unfortunately.

Chair Purdum moved to approve the minutes of the September 11, 2019 Special Supervisors Meeting. Supervisor Edwards seconded the motion. The motion passed with four (4) Supervisors voting in favor; Supervisor Evans-Herr was opposed. She was not present at that meeting.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Chair Purdum moved to approved checks 12299..... and the crowd yelled that they couldn't hear. The acoustics are bad in this Fire Engine Bay and they closed the doors – no motion was made or seconded by the Board; no vote was taken. The checks were mailed to vendors either 9/20/19 or 9/23/19.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Public comments are encouraged and welcomed from Pequea Township residents and taxpayers, only. Please come to the podium and limit your comments to three (3) minutes. If the conversation dictates more than three (3) minutes, time will be extended. By having organized public comments, we will be allowing more of our citizens to express their views. Comments for items on the agenda and items not on the agenda will be taken prior to the start of the Business Meeting.

Chair Purdum quickly went through the items on the agenda:

Old Business – #1 Future size of Pequea Twp Police Dept. He's going to recommend that the item is tabled to allow for more time to get data and information together so the proper decision can be made, especially for the public. #2 Grievance settlement and re-appoint Township Police Officer. Also, recommending a motion to table this item as we're not ready for it yet.

New Business - #1 Reduce one full time Police Officer to part time as a result of one Officer returning from Drug Task Force (DTF). Discuss this reduction since we're over-staffed and over-sized and currently in the budget, we're going to discuss making one full time officer, part time. #2 Hearing date for Ordinance to remove "no parking" signs on Casey Drive. Legal advertisement couldn't get to LNP in time to act on ordinance tonight. It will potentially be acted on at next month's meeting. #3 Local Services Tax (LST). Total LST paid by any taxpayer in a calendar year remains limited to \$52.00 #4 Permitting for Silver Mine Rd Bridge Wing Walls. Bridge at Silver Mine Rd and Marticville Rd showing erosion. Was budgeted for last year; discuss permitting for potential repair in 2020. #5 Resolution for destruction of record for Pequea Twp Police Dept. Old records to be destroyed at Chief Michener's recommendation. An addendum agenda item will be added to authorize repair of a police cruiser. In addition an addendum agenda item will be added to authorize the repair of a police cruiser at the recommendation of Chief Michener. Now we'll move on to Public Comments. Because of the large crowd, Public Comments will be limited to 30 minutes total. In addition, I am asking the supervisors to refrain from conversing during the public comments, so residents can speak. Please come to the lectern and state your name and your address and provide us with 3 minutes' worth of comments. The time is currently 7:08pm.

Items on the agenda:

Jackie Johns, Pequea Township I will not provide my home address as none of you supervisors have your home addresses on the Township Website nor do you provide your personal email addresses, just your township email address. On #1 of Old Business – why is tabeled and when do you expect to discuss the police department, or will it be when no one shows up? #4 under New Business –Wing Walls Repair on Silver Mine Rd bridge – will the PT Public Works Dept. be doing the work or will it be outsourced. I understand that not all of the Wing Walls are bad and that they might be fixed with just some caulk, not all of them need to be replaced? #1 under New Business – Officer returning from Drug Task Force. Financially it doesn't help the drug problem in the township; but we do have a drug problem in Pequea Township. As you all know, there was a fatal overdose in the township last week. Who would reduce a police force based on faulty township budgets without public input? By doing so, residents lose 24 hour police coverage. A reduced police force can't possibly provide 24 hour coverage without lots of overtime!

Richard Gerz, 33 Cobblestone Dr., Manchester Village I am here to support a full time police department. As the previous resident pointed out, the local drug activity is up and the expansion of housing and low-income housing in our area also seems to lead to more of that kind of "traffic" and I wholly oppose the idea of turning it over to State Police, who are spread razor thin as it is. They cannot respond in the time that your house is being broken into. So the idea of picking away at our full time police force is ridiculous. I sure hope it doesn't happen!

<u>Ann Ebersole, 20 Cobblestone Dr.</u> One thing that needs to be thought about when thinking of reducing the police force is what happened in our neighborhood a few years ago. A neighbor was standing outside waving a gun around. If he had shot someone, ambulance personnel cannot treat someone until the scene is cleared. If it takes State Police 45 minutes to respond to get to the scene and then clear it,

that person is going to die! So, if you are thinking of changing our PT Police Force to part time; and I'm assuming it would be overnight coverage that would go away. And, this is most likely when these kinds of things are going to occur. That response time is going to have a very big effect on a person that is injured. Obviously, I am greatly opposed to losing our PT Police Force to State Police. Their job is more important than money. And I think we have a lot of people who have said they will pay more in taxes to keep our PT Police Force staffed. And, I think if you took a survey, you would find that out.

Stewart Herr, 465 Long Ln. I'm representing 6 proxies (all here) on this issue. Based on the need for immediate response, we think our local PT Police Force does a fantastic job of doing so. We operate a wedding venue called The Farm at Eagles Ridge. We have hosted 517 weddings and fortunately have had zero issues. But knowing that our local police are just down the road, if we ever do have an incident, is very soothing to us. About 7 years ago, we held a fund raiser at our venue and raised \$15K because people supported not only the New Danville Fire Co., but the Police Force as well. We were able to give a check for \$7500.00 to the Police Force as well as a \$7500 check for a new local park. Obviously the people that attended this fund raiser believed in our local police. To know that you can make a phone call and have police protection within 5-10 minutes, in my opinion, is extremely important.

Keith Haun, 16 Cobblestone Dr. I think we all know why everybody is here and thank you for coming out tonight to support; it's very important that you come out and not just tonight. With the item being tabled you need to come out next month as well, and if you can bring more people with you, bring more people with you! Because the one time that people stop coming out, something will happen that none of us want, it's pretty clear. Before the last meeting, the Chairman put out a 12 minute video about the financial crisis in our township; it has since been taken down He also had handouts at the last meeting that had his website on the bottom of the page; that also has since been taken down. We were talking about transparency, that doesn't seem very transparent. I requested to talk with 2 Supervisors and I was shut down right away; they stated that we have to keep this in public meetings. Earlier this year, people asked the Chairman if there were just rumors going around or are we doing something like downsizing the police force. He replied that they were silly rumors and we're not doing anything with the police. Now here we are about 9 months out and we're trying to do something with the police. Let's have a show of hands, who wants to keep a full time police force - with all hands in the room raised, that speaks volumes of what the residents want and the Board still refuses to take questions or talk about the matter – where's the transparency in that? When this thing started out, it was quoted that we had a 340 some thousand dollar deficit and now it appears that money is a surplus not a deficit and it actually appears that there is somewhere close to a million in multiple accounts that makes me think we don't have a financial crisis on our hands at all.

Meredith Cooke, 15 Lark Ln. Thank you all for coming out tonight and please continue to come out to the township meetings; we need your support. The Board said that where were these people in 2015-2018? Well, we're here now! There is a discrepancy in the financial numbers the Township has been working on and I'm disappointed about that. The Police department needs to be a full time 24/7 police department; I think we've all agreed on that. There are 2 things we need to work on as far as the Board is concerned. First is the transparency that Chair Purdum put as the standard for his running the township at the beginning. I think we should continue to push for that as it seems to be lacking, right now. The video that you put out and also the hand-outs from a previous Supervisors' meeting were a great start; but now they've been retracted. You could have pre-empted this meeting with something similar to tell us why those items were pulled back; we're desperate for information. I know we won't have the back and forth like we had in the past, and I understand why; but I think that is a lack of transparency. The other thing is trust; there used to be trust, but now there's not. It will take some time to regain the trust. The #1 thing that the residents need to do now is to get hold of the budget

numbers as the Board doesn't seem to have full grasp of what the numbers are. I think we should have the budget actual numbers on the website – you can get the budget figures, but you can't get the actuals. I'd like to see the revenue in and revenue out along with actual numbers for 2015-2018 on the website. We want the same numbers that the Board is working with so that we can help and find solutions. You all ran with the statement, get the financial house in order. I can guarantee you that if you had stated that you want to get the financial house in order by downsizing and/or doing away with the police force, none of you would have been elected.

Stephanie Bernard, 14 Cobblestone Dr. I would like to give my 3 minute comment time to Keith Haun Keith Haun, 16 Cobblestone Dr. I handed the Chairman a couple sheets of well over 100 signatures of residents who want a full time Police department. There was a comment that the last meeting on this subject, there were probably people in the audience who didn't raise their hands for a 24/7 Police force because they would be heckled? I think it is pretty clear that the majority of residents want a 24/7 Police department in Pequea Twp. Of the roughly 100 township residents doors that I knocked on, only 5 people didn't want to sign the petition. That's 95% who are in favor of keeping the force on for 24/7 coverage. I believe that the Board needs to find a way to make the majority of the residents, who by the way voted for you, happy by finding a way to keep that coverage in-tact. The bottom line figures on the financial documents show a positive amount and not a negative one; I don't believe there is a financial deficit.

Chris Thomas, 597 Millwood Rd. I'd like to take a minute to thank John Michener and the whole police force on the excellent job they've done. A few months ago, they were at my house within 5 minutes for an issue with an unknown car parked outside. I believe the majority of the residents want to keep a full time 24/7 Police force, to protect the people. I'm asking for the Board to protect the police department. This is a very basic service of municipal government. We're not asking for a special interest that only serves a certain group of people; we're asking for ways to keep this basic service available. We're asking for options on how we can make this happen, so let's do it! I want my 5 kids to be protected – Thank you!

Sandy Craig, 12 Lark Ln. This is my first meeting, and I have to say that I'm shocked at the attitude of this Board, for those that have spoken. I think they need to come in with a better attitude, with more positivity and openness. I actually came to support a full time police dept. and I immediately felt this horrible feeling from a voice coming at us that I had never met before. I realized that I didn't know any of the Board and I've lived here quite a few years. I believe that a fulltime Police department is essential for our safety and well being. First I hear that there's not enough money to support them and then well, maybe we have enough money to support them? You guys need to get it together and work together and stop fighting amongst yourselves.

Items not on the agenda:

Jackie Johns, Pine Ln. This question for Chief Michener – I saw on police report that Pequea Township Police – but a Conestoga Twp response? I think people might be confused when they saw this.....can you explain. The incident I think you're talking about, occurred on Run Valley Rd. I usually try to catch these kinds of things where Pequea Twp. has 3 mailing addresses – Willow Street, Lancaster & Conestoga. Sometimes the mailing address is taken as the municipality and in this case, that's what happened. It was within Pequea Twp., but the mailing address was Conestoga and was inadvertently categorized as Conestoga Twp. The same kind of thing was true when the man that tried to knife the woman at Kendig Square, which is W. Lampeter Twp., was arrested. He lives in Pequea Twp. and had made his way back into Pequea Twp. when he was arrested, for the crime that occurred in W. Lampeter Twp., by W. Lampeter PD. It can be confusing sometimes by the time the information is in print. Thank you, Chief.

Now, you all are concerned about the police department; there is an election coming up. I would suggest that you find out where Mr. Lucas stands on the police department and if he doesn't support it, then maybe you all want to do a "write-in" candidate for this next election of a Supervisor.

I wonder why the precedent has been set for 7am & 9am meetings; in particular the budget meetings coming up. I believe the precedent has been set to exclude Cynthia Evans-Herr from attending these meetings, due to her work schedule. She's a whiz at this budget process; she's been doing them for 4 years and the others, except E. John, have never done one. I think it's outrageous that you set them for 7am or 9am so that working people cannot attend, only retired people can attend.

Meredith Cooke, 15 Lark Ln. I too wonder why the Budget Workshop meetings have to be at 9am for the first 2 and it appears the 3rd meeting at 6:30p won't be necessary and there goes the working peoples chance to attend and give input. I work at 9am so I hope that the 6:30pm is held; however, I did ask the Chairman to reschedule those meetings or at least 2 of them in the evening, so working people could attend, but I was shot down. One thing to note is that the Twp. staff that must participate in these meetings would have to be paid OT if they were held outside of their normal working hours, including the Treasurer. But I think in this unique situation, because there is not a clear cut statement of how much money this township has, at least 2 meetings should be held when working people can attend.

<u>Keith Haun, 16 Cobblestone Dr.</u> To piggyback on what Meredith just said on the financial stuff, and having the budget workshop meetings in the evening, the Township does have to pay OT monies to the staff attending meetings outside their normal work hours. That being said, there aren't many persons to whom this would apply. So you could make an exception, if you wanted to. They're discussing paying a full time officer to do part time when they've already gotten rid of a part time officer, so keep that in mind.

Al Strausner, W. Willow Rd. Since we're talking about budgets, the fire companies have a budget too. What I'm asking you all to do is to look at insurance policies. There are many addresses for Pequea Twp residents, so look at the policy and make sure that the municipality is listed as Pequea Twp., because Insurance Carriers outside of PA are mandated to pay a 2% tax to the municipality in PA where you reside. That is the fire companies relief association monies that the State pays to the Township. For example, my address is Willow Street and if I hadn't known and told the insurance company that I live in Pequea Township, that money would have gone to West Lampeter because the Willow Street Fire Company is in West Lampeter Twp.

Mary-Pequea Twp. We now know a little bit more about the budget after listening to Keith and Meredith. But my question to you is, since you tabeled the item on the police force to do more research, what kind of research have you done, since it was tabeled a second time. And, what kind of research are you still planning to do so that a decision can be made at the next township meeting? Supervisor Evans Herr commented that the reason no one on the board is answering your question is that at this time, the public comment is for items not on the agenda and your comment is for an item that is on the agenda.

Christine Henise, 27 Cobblestone Dr. Can I ask the Chief a question – Chief Michener, can you tell me, how many full time officers, per capita, are needed in Pequea Township. Chair Purdum stated - This is again, a public comment on an item that is on the agenda, and that public comment time is gone; but go ahead and answer the question for her. Chief Michener – the answer to that question and the statistics documented, well, it depends on where you go for that information. But in a perfect world, I would say 9 would be the number; 10 would be optimal, 9 full time officers would work. With the budget constraints the Township has, I would say, we can make 6 work, to have full patrol, ½ patrol and Chief & Sergeant patrol. C. Henise then commented to the Board – we voted you all in and we trusted that you would take care of us and our security. To get rid of or to change full time police officers to part-time police officers is unconscionable.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Discussion about the future size of the Pequea Township Police Department

Chair Purdum made a motion to table this item; Vice Chair Anthony Cazillo seconded it. Discussion: Supervisor Evans-Herr stated that she believes this agenda item should be "Take no Action", and removed to get it off of "Old Business" vs. tabled so that when the agenda item is "ready" to be acted upon, all residents will have the opportunity to be present when the Board does have that discussion. The motion was passed with 4 Supervisors voting in favor; Supervisor Evans-Herr was opposed.

2. Consider approving a grievance settlement and re-appoint Township Police Officer

Chair Purdum made a motion to table this item; Vice Chair Anthony Cazillo seconded it. Discussion: Supervisor Evans-Herr requested that the Legal Liaison provide to her all the information regarding this particular agenda item. I have not been provided any of the information and request that Chair Purdum provide all the communications on this since July 1, 2019. You have failed to do that as the Legal Liaison. The motion was passed with 3 Supervisors voting in favor; Supervisors Evans-Herr and Hlavacek were opposed.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Consider reducing one Full Time Police Officer to Part Time due to Officer returning from Drug Task Force

Chair Purdum made a motion to reduce one Full Time Police Office to Part Time status. It was seconded by Vice Chair Cazillo. The purpose of this is that we added since one Officer was sent back to us from the Drug Task Force – we're not reducing the size of the Police, we added one and now we're just going back to the level that we were at a couple of weeks ago. Discussion: Supervisor Evans-Herr stated that she sent an email to the Board regarding this particular agenda item. So we're going to deliberately change the status of one Full Time to Part Time, so that OT goes up for that Part Time Officer-that's why a Part Time Officer was made a Full Time Officer, since we had an Officer out this year (not for WC, but for nothing) plus one Officer working with the Drug Task Force; and we needed to make the Part Time Officer a Full Time Officer to curtail OT and for the purposes of having a full roster for coverage. If you look at the budget, there are plenty of funds available to keep that Officer at Full Time status for at least the remainder of this budget cycle. The motion passed with 4 Supervisors voting in favor; Supervisor Evans-Herr was opposed.

2. Consider hearing date for Ordinance to remove "No Parking" signs on Casey Drive

Chair Purdum made a motion to set the date for Ordinance Hearing to remove the "No Parking" signs on Casey Drive for October 16, 2019 at 6:30pm and authorize the Secretary to advertise said Ordinance. The motion was seconded by Supervisor Edwards. Supervisor Evans-Herr commented that if residents park on both sides of this road, there is not enough room for another car, or garbage truck, or emergency vehicles to pass through. This is a threat to public safety. Secondly, there were no budgeted funds for Ordinances for this year. The motion passed with 4 Supervisors voting in favor; Supervisor Evans-Herr was opposed.

3. Consider adopting Local Services Tax (LST) Ordinance

Supervisor Evans-Herr made a motion to authorize the Solicitor to prepare an Ordinance for the Local Services Tax. Strasburg Township enacted this LST in 2014 and the Solicitor could simply use their Ordinance as a template. The LST is a tax for persons that work within a township (Pequea) and the monies that are collected are used for Emergency and Municipal Services (Police) only. It is a one-time per year tax of maximum \$52.00 levied upon persons that work within Pequea township. The motion died for lack of a second.

4. Consider permitting for Silver Mine Road Bridge "Wing Walls"

Supervisor Edwards made a motion to authorize the Township Engineer to apply for the necessary permits to repair the Wing Walls of the Bridge on Silver Mine Road at Marticville Road. The motion was seconded by Chair Purdum. Supervisor Evans-Herr asked what the cost of the repair would be; where are the estimates and how much was budgeted for this work? I believe I remember that there was talk of \$40K and that it would be subcontracted out for the work. Chair Purdum stated that the motion was only to apply for the permits and then there would be a sit down to discuss the monies that would be involved at a later date. They budgeted for 40K in last year's budget for this work and this is just to start the process. The motion passed with 4 Supervisors voting in favor; Supervisor Evans-Herr was opposed.

5. Consider Resolution for destruction of records for Pequea Township Police Department

Chair Purdum made a motion to pass Resolution 525-2019 for the destruction of old Police Documents: Traffic and Non Traffic Citation prior to 2016

Parking Tickets prior to 2016

Non-Criminal Offense reports prior to 2014 (excluding suspicious death investigations)

Crash Reports prior to 2014 (excluding fatal crashes or ones involving criminal activity)

Daily activity logs prior to 2014

Calibration records prior to 2014

Court Orders prior to 2014

UCR Work Sheets prior 2014

Supervisor Edwards seconded the motion. Chair Purdum noted that a resolution will need to be passed by Conestoga Township for the Southern Regional Police Commission in order to complete the destruction.

Supervisor Evans-Herr commented that the destruction of these paper records is in accordance with Pennsylvania State Law and Chief Michener concurred that the records are mostly backed up electronically and they are legally able to destroy them per the retention schedule set forth. We are running out of room to hold these records. The motion was passed with all voting in favor; none opposed.

Update: At Conestoga Township Board of Supervisors Meeting on October 1, they did not have the resolution on their agenda

Chair Purdum asked Chief Michener if he'd like to state his report or is it just on the table? He replied that it is on the table but would give a brief synopsis of the month.

There were 486 total incidents in August which includes 8 crashes and 28 reported crimes. 83 traffic citations were issued and 30 warnings were given. There were 10 criminal arrests. 4,507 miles were traveled in August. There 32 hours of vacation, and 10 hours of sick time utilized.

The motion was passed with all voting in favor; none opposed. Supervisor Evans-Herr asked where the car was going for repair – Honeysuckle Hill Auto Service.


