- Chairman Lehman announced that an Executive Session was held at 6:30 tonight regarding personnel matters.
- Chairman Lehman moved to add item *(#13) to tonight's agenda regarding the wages of road crew employee Craig Mellinger. Supervisors Haas and Lucas seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

MINUTES of PREVIOUS MEETINGS:

1. Consider approving the minutes of the March 16, 2022 Board of Supervisors Meeting.

Supervisor Lucas moved to approve the minutes of the March 16, 2022 Board of Supervisors Meeting. Supervisor Novak seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: A copy of the bill list is on the table

Chairman Lehman moved to approve checks #13870-13949 from the General Fund/checks #1916-1927 from the Recreation Fund/checks #1182-1183 from the Donation Fund/check #1104 from the American Rescue Plan fund and void check #413 from the State Highway Fund. Supervisor Hlavacek seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Chairman Lehman gave a synopsis of the 13 items on the agenda

ITEMS ON THE AGENDA:

- Jackie Johns asked if the expenditures and amounts from the American Rescue Plan Funds and any balance could be known.
- Scott Edwards commended the Board on their wise handling and use of American Rescue Plan Funds.

ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA: none

OLD BUSINESS: none

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Authorize National Night Out (NNO) to be held August 2, 2022 and authorize expenditures from the NNO donation fund. NNO to provide certificate of insurance from Big Bright Bounces

Chairman Lehman moved to authorize NNO to be held August 2, 2022, and authorize expenditures from the NNO Donation Fund subject to proper insurance certificate from vendors, i.e. Big Bright Bounce. Supervisor Novak seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

2. Workman's Compensation and Liability Insurance Policy Updates

Supervisor Lucas moved that we upgrade our cybersecurity insurance to one million dollars at a cost of \$782.00. Supervisor Novak seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

Supervisor Lucas moved that we increase our liability insurance deductible from \$1000 to \$2000 per annum. Vice-Chairman Haas seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

3. Consider PA Certified Workman's Compensation Safety Committee

Chairman Lehman moved that we form a workman's comp certified safety committee. Vice-Chairman Haas seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

4. Consider hiring a part-time township road crew/CDL driver-Paul Frymyer eff. 5-2-22 at \$22.28 per hour

Vice-Chairman Haas moved to hire Paul Frymyer as part-time road crew employee at a rate of \$22.28 per hour effective 5/2/2022. Supervisor Lucas seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

5. Consider purchase of components to upgrade Network WIFI Security

Chairman Lehman moved that we purchase the Network WIFI Security for an approximate price of \$6000. Supervisor Novak seconded the motion. Supervisors Lehman, Haas, Lucas and Novak voted in favor; Supervisor Hlavacek opposed.

6. Consider approval of Final Subdivision and Land Development Plan for West Penn Grant Road Self-Service Storage via Resolution

Chairman Lehman then read a lengthy list of motions related to the Self-Storage Units. These 14 motions are included as an attachment to be part of the minutes. Chairman Lehman made all 14 motions and all voted in favor of each. The supervisors seconding the motions are as listed: #1 Haas, #2&3 Lucas, #4 Novak, #5 Lucas, #6 Haas, #7 Lucas, #8 Novak, #9 Haas, #10-13 Lucas and #14 Haas.

Supervisor Hlavacek moved that we provide conditional approval for the sewage plan so the developers can get their paperwork started with the DEP. Chairman Lehman seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

7. Discuss expenditures from American Rescue Plan funds and approve those expenditures via Resolution

Chairman Lehman explained how monies received from the American Rescue Fund were and are planned to be spent. Vice-Chairman Haas told how monies were and are to be spent on road, bridge and culvert projects.

Chairman Lehman moved that we earmark \$6000 from the American Rescue Fund for the purchase of two (2) tasers and \$6000 from the General Fund for the purchase of the other two (2) tasers. Supervisor Novak seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

Vice-Chairman Haas moved that we give each fire company \$6,800 out of the American Rescue Fund. Supervisor Novak seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

Supervisor Lucas moved that we approve **Resolution # 601-2022** to use the American Rescue Plan Funds to purchase a new generator, including the installation on the new main panel, from the Ferndale Property Group, approximate purchase price of \$18,641, which was approved at the March 16, 2022 BOS Meeting. Supervisor Novak seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

Chairman Lehman moved that we proceed with the plans and the engineering to construct a new Township salt shed per plans given to us by Providence Township. Supervisor Novak seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed. Supervisor Lucas then publicly thanked Providence Township for saving Pequea Township money by providing the plans.

Chairman Lehman moved that we purchase two (2) tasers for the price of approximately \$6000 from the General Fund. Supervisor Novak seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

Chairman Lehman moved that we formally approve by **Resolution # 602-2022-** \$6000 for WIFI security, \$6000 for two (2) tasers, \$6,800 to New Danville Fire Company, and \$6,800 to West Willow Fire Company out of the American Rescue Fund. Supervisor Novak seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

8. Verify intent to purchase 1-LPG Standby Generator, main electrical panel and installation of both with American Rescue Plan Funds, via Resolution (this purchase was approved in the March 16, 2022 Board of Supervisors meeting)

9. Discuss Salt Shed Project (Capital Reserve Funds)

10. Consider Purchase of four (4) Tasers for the Pequea Township Police Department; two (2) from the General Fund and twp (2) from the American Rescue Plan Funds.

11. Consider Resolution# 603-2022 supporting the Pennsylvania Commission for the United States Semiquincentennial (commemorates the 250th anniversary of the USA in 2026 and PA's integral role in that event)

Supervisor Novak moved that we support the Pennsylvania Commission of the United States Semiquincentennial (commemorates the 250th anniversary of the USA in 2026 and PA's integral role in that event) via **Resolution #603-2022.** Supervisor Lucas seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

12. Consider annual Fire Company donation

Vice-Chairman Haas moved to pay \$30,500 to New Danville Fire Company and \$30,500 to West Willow Fire Company out of the General Fund. Supervisor Hlavacek seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

*13. Wage compensation for road crew employee Craig Mellinger (addendum)

Vice-Chairman Haas moved to pay Craig Mellinger \$2.49 per hour worked from February 8 thru April 9, 2022. Supervisor Hlavacek seconded the motion. All voted in favor; none opposed.

Supervisor Novak summarized the benefits and efforts of the Lancaster County Conservation District. He emphasized how well they work with landowners and school groups.
